# Associate Professor of Latin American civilization (Brazil

The Department of Foreign Languages, University of Bergen, is seeking to appoint a full-time, tenured Associate Professor of Latin American civilization (Brazil studies), starting in January 2014. The successful candidate will work at the Department of Foreign Languages, Faculty of Humanities, University of Bergen. She or he must be willing to reside permanently in the Bergen area. Reasonable removal expenses will be paid.

#### About the position

The programme in Spanish Language and Latin American Studies is one of the subject areas of the Department of Foreign Languages. The department currently has a little over 50 permanent academic staff, 11 administrative staff, approx. 30 Ph.D. fellows and a number of other temporary staff. The department conducts research and offers teaching in Arabic, Chinese (Mandarin), English, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Russian and Spanish Language and Latin American Studies. In Spanish Language and Latin American Studies, there are currently 9 1/2tenured positions: four in language, two in cultural studies, two in literature and one (50 %) in Spanish didactics. In addition, there are Ph.D. fellows in Spanish Language and Latin American Studies. The Department now wishes to integrate Brazilian studies and language (Brazil-Portuguese) into the current study programmes.

The department is strongly committed to international collaboration in research as well as graduate and undergraduate education, and has cooperation agreements with a number of countries in Europe, Africa, North America and Latin America.

#### **Oualification requirements**

The successful candidate must have a Norwegian doctorate in f. ex. Brazilian history, Brazil studies, Brazilian anthropology or similar, or a doctorate from a foreign institution that is equivalent to a Norwegian doctorate. She or he must be able to teach beginner's courses in Brazilian studies, but also be able to teach at more advanced levels and supervise master and doctoral students. The successful candidate must also be able to teach in Spanish and communicate in Spanish in order to participate actively and share overall responsibility for the subject and contribute to the continuing development of the educational programme. Participation in administrative tasks is also expected.

Teaching, student assignments and examining are conducted in Portuguese and Spanish, while Norwegian is the language of administration at the Department. The successful applicant is expected to have a good knowledge of Norwegian or another Scandinavian language, or be willing to learn Norwegian within two years after appointment.

The University of Bergen refers to the general rules and regulations at the university which states that as part of the normal duties of the position, the successful applicant may also be required to undertake teaching, supervision and work in connection with examinations in his or her particular field outside the organisational unit to which the appointment belongs.

Basic teaching competence is a requirement, but the successful applicant who does not have such competence at the time of his/her appointment will be offered training and will be required to produce evidence of such competence within two years of the date of appointment

The University Board points out that teaching qualifications are given particular weight in appointing associate professors and professors. Applicants must document teaching qualifications by providing, for example:

- evidence of completed teacher training
- evaluation reports on the applicant's teaching overview of scope and level of teaching
- overview of post-graduate and doctoral candidates supervision, and results obtained
- student awards received own teaching publications
- own teaching compendia and material reports showing participation in projects related to the development of teaching, such as forms of teaching, supervision or teaching environments.

Salary will be paid in accordance with pay level 57 (code 1011/pay framework 24), at present NOK 473.100 gross p.a., following ordinary meriting regulations. Higher initial placement may be considered for particularly well–qualified applicants. A pension contribution of 2 % will be deducted and paid to the state pension scheme.
